The 9th Korean Studies Association of Australasia (KSAA) biennial conference will be held at the University of South Australia, Adelaide from 25 November to 27 November 2015.

The Program Committee for the 2015 Biennial Conference invites PhD students, early career researchers and academic colleagues to the University of South Australia to present their research and enhance our understanding of Korea in the world today.

Individual Paper and Panel Submissions

Organised panels are preferred, but individual papers are welcome as well. Panels that combine presentations by PhD students together with academics are especially encouraged. Panel and individual proposals should have an extended abstract (350-500 words) and panel proposals for an abstract for each of the individual papers (350-500 words).

Paper and panel submissions for KSAA 2015 need to be categorized into one of 6 tracks. Each paper or panel proposal must be submitted to only one track. Please select the track closest to your proposal from the list below.

Roundtables Submissions

Suggestions for innovative roundtable are welcome. Roundtables may be organised around a theme, discipline, policy or research question, or could be focused on discussion of an important book in the field. Roundtables may feature up to five speakers, and no less than three. Instead of 15-20 minute papers, roundtable presenters will deliver short presentations (approximately 5 minutes) that will be moderated by the roundtable chair. These abbreviated presentations will leave plenty of time for discussion generated by presenters as well as members of the audience. Proposals for roundtables must include an application form with abstract (350-500 words).

- Late or incomplete submissions will not be considered.
- The official language of the conference is English. Papers (for presentation) in Korean may be considered, but all abstracts must be written in English.
